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February 6 – System for Award Management (SAM) and Dynamic Small Business Search (DSBS) Registrations

From layout to data, SAM.gov has made dozens of minor and significant changes. Search queries, NAICS code information; self-certification, etc., are just some of the topics that have been modified in this federal database that, as a government contractor, you are required to be registered in and to keep updated annually. Join this webinar to learn more about the SAM.gov registration process, as well as its changes, along with updates to SBA's Dynamic Small Business Search (DSBS) database - your electronic capability statement for the government.

March 13 – Davis Bacon and Service Contract Act (Wage and Hour Requirements)

The wage and hour session will offer an overview of the Service Contract Act and federal Davis-Bacon laws and the everyday application of these laws in the workplace. The webinar will cover the issues central to government contract compliance including prevailing wage and fringe benefit requirements, completing certified payrolls, specific record keeping requirements and guidelines for the correct payment of overtime. This session will also include a discussion on the problem areas most common in government contract compliance.
